THE INTERNSHIP: The Art and Wilderness Institute is looking for an adaptable, enthusiastic, responsible, and curiosity-driven individual with a teaching background to be the Field Instructor Intern. As the Field Instructor Intern, you will be responsible for creating curricula, assisting in the field, teaching free "Community Classes", translating lessons from your observation into teaching resources, lesson plans, and aligning them with state-standards. Field Instructor Interns will tag along on adventures, big or small, follow along on classes and help create learnables from lessons. Once comfortable with the Native Flora and Fauna of California, Interns will be given the opportunity to practice field teaching.

Field Instructor Intern Pay Rate: Unpaid, class credit with school approval. Material fees reimbursed with receipt for pre-approved projects. Interns will get to keep a copy of all materials created.

DURATION: August 20, 2020 to December 20, 2020

Days: Mondays, 9am to 3pm, Weekly

Time: 4 hours minimum, Flexible as long as you stick to the same time slot each time.

JOB DUTIES:

- Follow along on classes and create "Learnables" based on the lesson.
- Develop lesson-plans based on programs you have already seen.
- Develop lesson-plans based on themes and subjects you are given.
- Teach in the field with students
- Manage Project-Learning experiences
- Be on time to teach and assist.

TRAINING:

- Introductory walk through of mission, programs, and vision.
- Train via phone calls, zoom meetings, in person and onsite for each of the tasks.
 - Assess level of skills and teach where skills are lacking.
- Review tasks and offer feedback and demonstrations to encourage growth
